COLLECTORS

CORNER Of all the semiautomatic keys manufactured in the world, there was only one that was manufactured as a kit. This was the Electric Specialty Company bug manufactured starting in 1939. Two versions were made of this bug, one with a shorting lever and one without. The bug has a yoke similar to the Vibroplex "Original" and a damper similar to the one on the Speed X 500 series of keys.

The bug was nicknamed the "Cedar Rapids Key" since the company was based in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

The base is cast and measures 7 ½" by 3". Cast into the bottom of the key is the legend "ELECTRIC SPECIALTY MFG CO, CEDAR RAPIDS IOWA". The base is finished in black crackle finish and the feet were press fit black rubber on each corner.

The company identified the key with a circuit closing switch as a "Telegraph Key" while the one without the closing switch is classified as a "Radio Key". Besides these designations the Cedar Rapids key can be identified as "Old Model-Model 1" and 'New Model-Model 2". The major differences that allow you to readily identify which model you are looking at are:

Old Model:

- a. Straight 3" circuit closer lever on right side.
- b. Damper frame cast brass, painted black.

New Model:

- a. Circuit closer is right angle and mounts under paddle.
- b. There is a platform between the two rear feet that allows the mounting of a fifth higher foot to al-

low the rear of the key to be raised off the desk. References:

LETTER FROM THE WEATHER DRILL



On Tuesday morning March 20, 2001, there was an severe weather emergency exercise drill. The National Weather Service in Pittsburgh in conjunction with SKYWARN and EMA, and amateur radio operators test their equipment and skills in handling and/or monitoring the severe weather test messages during this drill.

At the Fayette County 911 Center, Pat, WB3LUC, Kirk, N3EKP, and Mike, KA3WOI, operated the ham gear for the drill, and other hams checked in via 2 meters including KE3RS, KA3WSO, K3FQI, K3FCY, KB3BKW, N3ROA, WA3WAW, N3YSX, KA3WOH, W3ICX, WA3HQK, KB3AQK, andWX3PIT at the National Weather Service in Pittsburgh (NOAA Weather Radio).

The 147.045 repeater was used for the drill on 2 meters, also

3990.5 kHz on 75 meters was to be used, but a solar disturbance cut the signal strengths way down on that band, so the activity on 75 was low. Some local hospitals, schools, and nursing homes are equipped with weather radios tuned to 162.55 MHz with a tone squelch circuit designed to open on the alert signal from the weather service. Hams called to verify that the simulated severe weather test signals were in fact received by the various locations. Pat said that the test was successful and it was a good exercise. Pat said that Roy Shipley, the Fayette County EMA director/911 Director was quite pleased with the turnout of the event.
