CLASSES COMPLETED

Classes to help students prepare for the Technician license exam were held at W3PIE on Tuesday nights in January and February from 6 PM to 8 PM. Most of the students in this class are members of the search and rescue team in Fayette County and have dogs trained for search and rescue operations. These students had been introduced to ham radio by other search and rescue teams in other counties who used 2 meters in their field exercises and searches.

Bert, WA3WAW, was the instructor, and was assisted by George, WA3OGQ, Dave, N3QAS, Tony, KA3VOR, and Tim, W3ZVT. Sometimes the class would continue past 8 PM to cover all of the material on that particular week. And then after the class was over, the instructors would get on the air and see who could be QSO'd with, both HF and VHF, concluding around 9 PM.

The class lasted five weeks, finishing in time for the February 18th VE Exam at the club. The textbook used in the class was the "Now You're Talking" FOURTH edition, the new book that reflects the license restructuring after April 15, 2000, which allows an unlicensed person to prepare for the Technician test. The \$19 book includes the question pool and the chapters of text explaining the material in depth The Technician test is now a 35 question multiple choice test.

So keep your ears peeled for these new hams on the radio and make sure to say hello to them. Congratulate them and invite them to the W3PIE club meetings. Make them feel that we're glad they joined the ranks of ham radio. (You know all of this already, this last paragraph is just a friendly reminder, hi)
