
## BAD WEATHER PRECAUTIONS

The Poucel El-Key was manufactured in very small numbers by Robert Poucel, W2AYJ, during the sixties. They were manufactured with gray, chrome and black bases and have an enameled tag identifying it as an El Key. The El-Key is a single lever key and is noniambic . From all indications only 400 El-Keys were made before Robert Poucel ceased



manufacturing the key. It was manufactured and sold from 1959 to 1963 and was advertised in both CQ and QST. The chrome based keys appear to be the most rare.

Amateur Radio Club Contest As you know, amateur radio is a valuable communication resource to our community in times of need. Whether responding to a disaster or providing communications for public service events, amateur radio has always been there to contribute its time, manpower and equipment to a variety of events. As an ARRL affiliated club, you set the example for public service both within the ranks of amateur radio and in your community. The UPMC Medical Center/City of Pittsburgh Marathon has again requested amateur radio support for this event. The marathon is scheduled for Sunday, May 6, 2001. Amateur radio has been a vital part of the success of previous marathons. Unfortunately, over the past few years the number of amateur radio volunteers for the marathon has dropped off considerably. To become part of this event, you can register electronically by going to http://www.cs.pitt. edu/~hoffman/marathon.html. We will be needing at least 150 volunteers to cove the mile, aid station. shadow and vehicle assignments. If this will be your first time, we will pair you with an experienced operator. All you will need is your 2 mtr or 440 HT or mobile unit. As in the past, assignments will be

mailed the week of the marathon. We will also have our pre race get together the day before the race to pass out shirts, hats. credentials and answer any question you might have. There will also be a volunteer appreciation party a few weeks after the event. Once again, The UPMC Medical Center/City of Pittsburgh Marathon would like to present plaques to the Amateur Radio Clubs that provide the highest percentage of volunteers for the marathon. Last year's plaques went to The Carnegie Tech ARC and the North Hills ARC. This year, 3 plagues will be awarded. In an effort to even the playing field, plaques will be awarded to the

clubs that: 1. Have 50 or less members; 2. Between 51 - 150 members; 3. 151 members or more.

The rules are simple:

1. Volunteers will indicate their Amateur Radio Club membership(s) on the amateur radio marathon application. Volunteers who belong to more than one club can indicate each club they belong to. Each club will receive credit for that member volunteering.

2. The ARC clubs considered to be the winners will be the clubs with the highest percentage of its members in each of the 3 categories who volunteer. The percentage of volunteers from each club will be based on the members who check in on the day of the event. The total number of club members will be determined by club information on the ARRL Club Member web site as of 5/1/01.

I invite you to volunteer. Many





