#### **Important (SET) Simulated Emergency Test**

Public service communications have been a traditional responsibly of the Amateur Radio Service since 1913, when amateurs at the University of Michigan and Ohio State University, in conjunction with numerous individual amateurs in and around the region, successfully bridged the communications gap surrounding a large isolated area left by a severe windstorm in the Midwest. In those early days, such disaster work was spontaneous and without previous organization of any kind. In today's Amateur Radio, disaster work is a highly organized and worthwhile part of day-to-day operation, implemented principally through the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and the National Traffic System (NTS), both sponsored by the ARRL. The Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES), independent nets and other amateur public service groups are also a part of Amateur Radio public service efforts. Every year the ARRL, in conjunction with the other amateur radio public service organizations mentioned above, sponsors a nationwide drill of communications known as the SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST or (SET). This year the SET will be on the 17th day of November, a Saturday, from 9am to noon. The exact frequencies on the vhf and H.F. bands will be announced closer to the SET date on the 9pm Thursday night net on 147.045... We sure would like to see as many Fayette County hams as possible check in to the SET net on the 17th..... "73"

#### Do You Have Back-up Power for Emegency Use?

The need for back-up power is something I suspect few Amateurs actually deal with in his/her station. If there is an emergency that causes the local supply of electricity to fail, how many of us actually have a means by which to operate and do so in a timely manner. Yeah ... You could run out to your car and rip out the battery, or use an HT. But what if there is a need for a high power station to be made available for the emergency.

Ham's are arguably the most ingenious bunch of hobbyists in our nation, and can also provide a useful resource in such situations. I am sure that with all the work we do on grounding systems, tower construction, cable runs through our shack walls, and all the other station set-up issues we deal with, how many of us actually have an external, long-lasting source of back-up power? And if we do, does it come on without interruption. We go out and purchase UPS for our computers, but do we do the work to build high capacity energy storage systems for our stations? It is very possible to build such systems, but you hear very little in this area in publications and general QSO discussions.

Several Hams have described to me systems they have designed for regular use, in place of power supplies, utilizing multiple large storage cells, placed outdoors, with plenty of protection from the elements and ventilation. It would be interesting to hear about various high power, high current, large capacity emergency back-up power systems that other Ham's have designed and utilize. Does anyone use an automatic system that kickson, in a seamless way, when local AC fails?

I think all Ham's should remember their primary responsibility the privilege of having a ticket bears, and consider working on some type of systems for quick and lasting power during a power challenged emergency. I will be ... What do you think? John LeVasseur - W2WDX

# COLLECTORS CORNER By Tim Soxman W3ZVT

A key that is easy to mistake for the Vibroplex original is the Vibroplex Junior. The Junior was officially produced from 1934 to 1939 and was called by Martin/ Vibroplex a Junior in their 1934 ads. There was a "small based" Vibroplex produced from 1921 to 1934 but it was not at that time called a "Junior". The Junior was produced with a three inch wide by six inch long base. This is one half inch shorter and narrower than the Vibroplex Original. It is very easy to mistake a Junior for an Original so when you're looking at Vibroplex keys it might be wise to have a ruler on hand. The Junior came in a japanned or nickel base and I have on hand a late Junior with a 796 Fulton Street address, 1926 D3 plate, that is black wrinkle finish. The Vibroplex collectors guide lists the Vibroplex Junior as "uncommon".
